A River's Rights

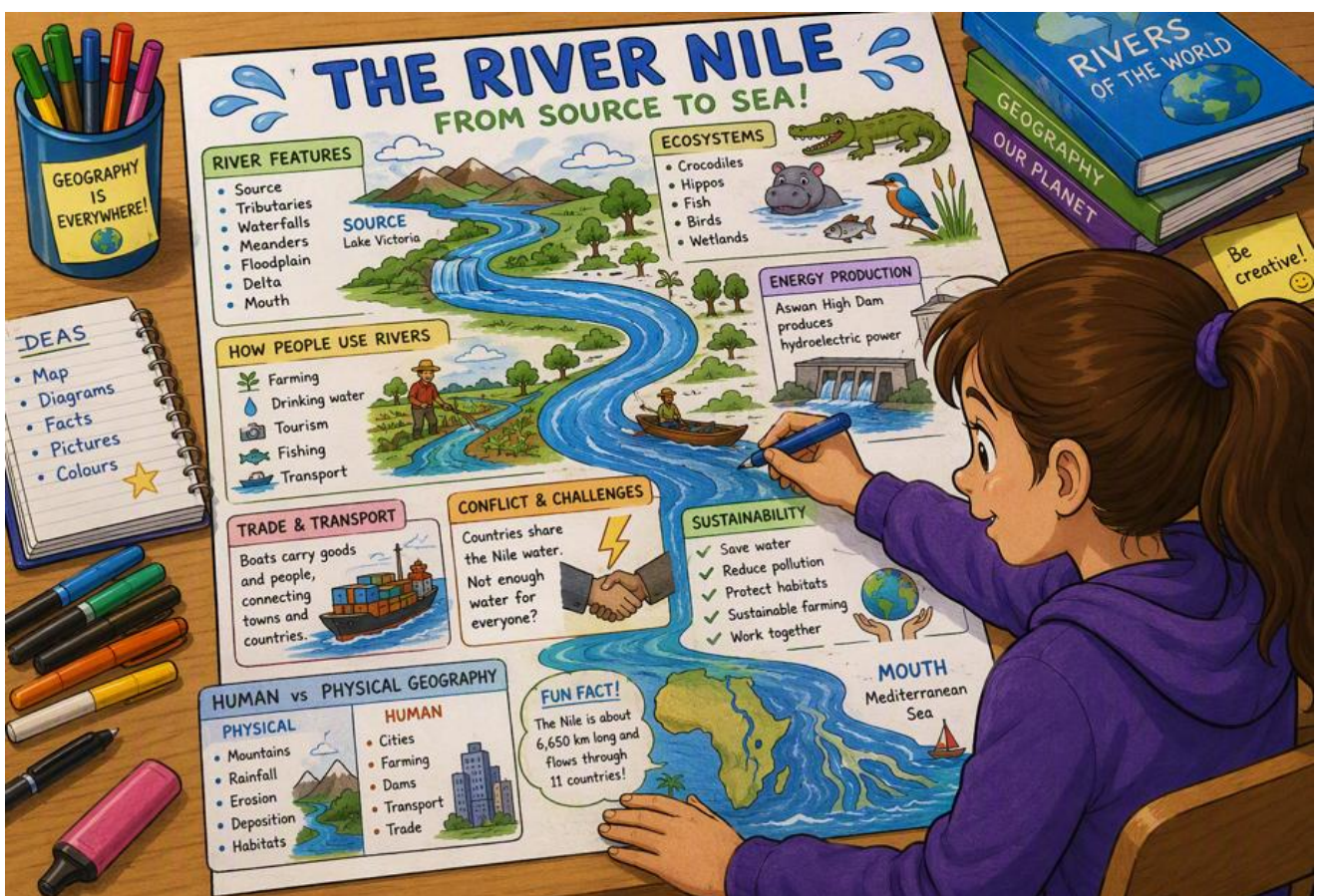
